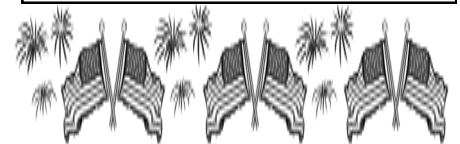

American Flag Etiquette**National Anthem Etiquette**

The American flag comes with a lot of history, which is why members of the organization constructed the National Flag Code. This is under Public Law 94-344 and contains the appropriate flag etiquette. Including rules on handling the American flag and honoring the nation's most iconic symbol of freedom. Although the U.S flag code does not have any penalties, each state has their own individual flag code which may impose penalties for misusing the flag.

Respecting the flag is crucial to maintaining its dignity. There are established guidelines for proper display and handling, ensuring that the flag is treated with the reverence it deserves. This includes proper folding, respectful display, and dignified retirement when the flag is no longer fit for use.

The American flag's journey from a revolutionary banner to a global symbol of freedom is a testament to the enduring values and resilience and patriotic pride of the American people. Each star and stripe tells a story of struggle, growth, and triumph, reflecting the nation's ongoing quest for liberty and justice.

As we honor the flag, we also honor the ideals and sacrifices that have shaped America into the land of the free and the home of the brave.

Since 1998, federal law (viz., the United States Code [36 U.S.C. § 301](#)) states that during a rendition of the national anthem, when the flag is displayed, all present including those in uniform should stand at attention; non-military service individuals should face the flag with the right hand over the heart; members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are present and not in uniform may render the military salute; military service persons not in uniform should remove their head-dress with their right hand and hold the head-dress at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart; and members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are in uniform should give the military salute at the first note of the anthem and maintain that position until the last note. The law further provides that when the flag is not displayed, all present should face toward the music and act in the same manner they would if the flag were displayed. Military law requires all vehicles on the installation to stop when the song is played and all individuals outside to stand at attention and face the direction of the music and either salute, in uniform, or place the right hand over the heart, if out of uniform. The law was amended in 2008, and since allows military veterans to salute out of uniform, as well.
